XX ENTOG event/Antwerp congress

A local organising committee (LOC) of predominantly Flemish Belgian trainees has been formed as you all know. The committee is in active discussion with the ENTOG executive, hospitals and the Flemish senior society VVOG. Hospitals are being approached by the LOC.

ENTOG executive has attended the first congress meetings with EBCOG and the congress organisers to try and optimise trainee representation and conditions. Synchronising our program with the congress and forming part of the congress forms interesting challenges and a program you will want to attend! A start has already been made with the design of the ENTOG session program and promises to become very interesting for both trainees and other congress attenders.

ENTOG 2009 survey European Working Time Directive (EWTD).

In the last few months of the year we sent out our 2009 survey EWTD. This is a very important survey as it monitors the preparations for and compliance with this directive especially since there is an impression that there are wide differences across Europe. ENTOG feels it is important to monitor this process and its effects on training quality. It will be vital to know these data on a European level and to communicate this! We hope to get three answers from every country, from various types of hospitals to optimise the validity of the results.

Thank you very much Portugal, Finland, Netherlands and Sweden for returning (some) questionnaires so far.

We aim for a 100% response rate, please help us to reach this! The questionnaire can be filled out online after following a special link which is provided to all members. As a reminder we will invite all our members again shortly to fill it out at their convenience. If you feel your trainee network has not received an invitation for the survey, then let us know at executive@entog.org and we can check the details.

We will feed back the results of the survey during the Hungary meeting and also present them on the website afterwards.

ENTOG elections

In June 2009 there are statutory elections for the following posts

- President (not standing for re election)
- Secretary general (eligible for re-election)
- o Treasurer (eligible for re-election)
- Member (eligible for re-election)

However, we would very much like to encourage trainees from our member countries to consider a role for themselves in the executive. It may be important to stress that current members may stand for a different post than their current one. All posts assume a two year term.
